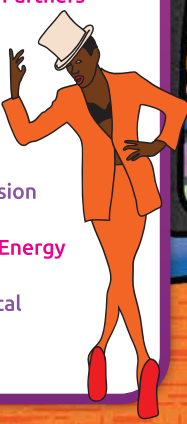

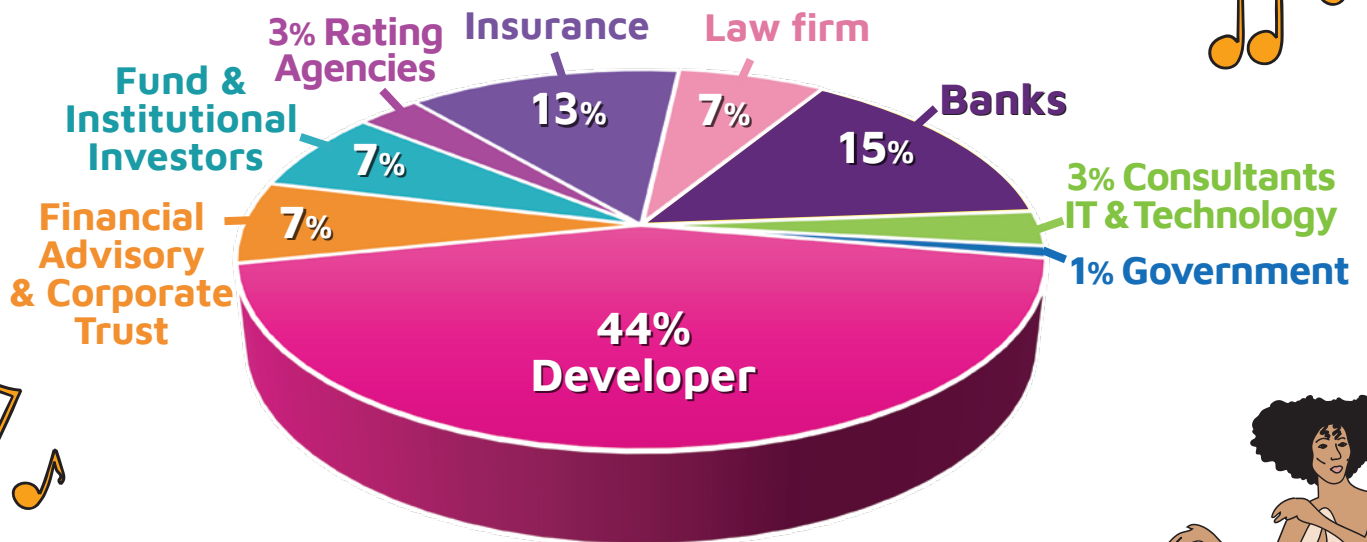

TOP TAKEAWAYS FROM 2022

- 1** The Inflation Reduction Act IS a huge game-changer for the US energy sector. But there is still uncertainty about how the incentives will work, and much of the benefit will be eaten up by higher construction costs.
- 2** There has been a fall in liquidity across debt markets. Bank groups will be asked to work harder, and the 144A bond market is still very weak. But new sources of institutional debt - particularly the Term B market, could compensate.
- 3** Gas plants will still have a part to play in the energy transition, and midstream infrastructure and LNG will be looking for large amounts of capital. ESG concerns will moderate, but not completely cut off, access to capital in this segment. Hydrogen offers huge opportunities if it can be slotted into midstream and upstream operations.
- 4** Deployment of EV infrastructure in the US will be a challenge, but alternative solutions such as battery leasing, RNG-based technologies and fleet leasing models might create bankable transactions.
- 5** The DoE Loan Programs Office is starting to establish itself as a meaningful source of support for newer technologies and business models. Green-labelled finance - if applied flexibly - could also make the difference to newer and transition technologies.

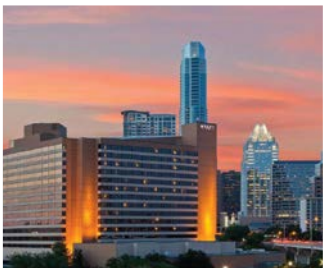
